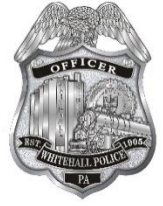

Patrol Division Report *June 2026*

OFFICER STATUS REPORT

- PPO Ken Andris was hired by the department on Monday June 29, 2026.
- PPO Hunsicker resigned from the Field Training Program.

PATROL ACTIVITY

- Officers completed 1,018 initial reports this month.
- Patrol Officers investigated 32 reportable and 70 non-reportable crashes.
- Patrol charged 102 Crimes & Vehicle Code (associated with criminal charges) sections this month. See attached list of charges.
- Patrol Officers conducted 531 vehicle enforcement actions for the month of June. Year to date, the Patrol Division has conducted 4,376 vehicle enforcement actions (citation, warning, parking ticket).

LEHIGH COUNTY EMERGENCY RESPONSE TEAM (LCERT) ACTIVITIES

- We currently have five members assigned to the team.
- ERT assisted Slatington Police Department with a warrant service.

TRAINING

- This month two officers attended commercial motor vehicle inspection training, one officer attended a firearm instructor certification course, and three officers attended crime scene processing training.
- Next month, two detectives are scheduled to attend a homicide investigation course.

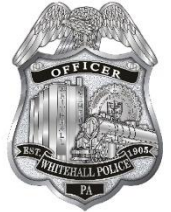

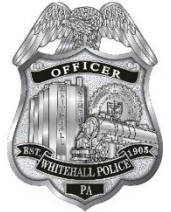

Criminal Investigation Division Report *June 2026*

Significant Arrests or Incidents:

The Detective Division assisted patrol with several follow-ups. They also assisted patrol with photo lineups for suspect identifications and identifying suspects in various incidents.

The Detectives had a total of 4 arrests, 29 cleared cases and 31 cases assigned between 4 Detectives for this month. They finished the background investigations for the entry level police applicants which resulted in one new hire.

The Whitehall Crime Scene Processing Unit (CSPU) will be assisting the Lehigh County Accident Investigation Team in processing scenes outside Whitehall Township. Those crime scene statistics are not included in the monthly report.

The Whitehall Police Crime Scene Processing Unit (CSPU) processed 1 scene this month consisting of a criminal mischief to a vehicle (WH-26-08035).

The Cellebrite and Magnet Forensics machine was used for 1 device this month for the Pornography/Obscene Material involving a juvenile victim.

Arrests

The Detective Division had 4 arrests this month. The following is a summary of those arrests:

Endangering Welfare of Children

WH-26-07125

Whitehall Police were called to a residence for a check on the welfare of 4 children who appeared to be unsupervised, unclothed, crying and in the side yard of the home. Upon arrival Patrol Officers observed 3 juveniles playing with toys in the side yard, with no shirts on and the side door to the house to be wide open. A 4th child was found inside the home. The ages of the children were 10, 7, 5 and 3 years old. It was determined that there was no parent or older sibling at home with the children and the 10-year-old was left in charge. It was discovered that the Father was at work, and the Mother was contacted on the phone who stated she was at a Doctor appointment with her teenage daughter and would be home soon. The assigned Detective was able to review video from a neighbor and determine the children had been left unsupervised for approximately 6 hours until WPD arrived on scene. Both parents were charged with the following:

- (2) Counts Endangering the Welfare of Children (under 6yoa), Felony 3
- (2) Counts Endangering the Welfare of Children, Misdemeanor 1

Access Device Fraud**WH-26-07052**

Whitehall Police took a report from the victim who reported unauthorized transactions on multiple debit cards after losing his wallet at a restaurant in the Township. The victim discovered completed and attempted unauthorized purchases at stores in Whitehall and Allentown that totaled over \$880 in completed ones and another \$280 in attempted purchases. The assigned Detective was able to view video surveillance at these stores and utilized license plate readers to be able to identify two suspects. Both suspects worked together at some point for these unauthorized transactions, utilizing the victims debit cards. The suspects were charged with and picked up on arrest warrants for the following:

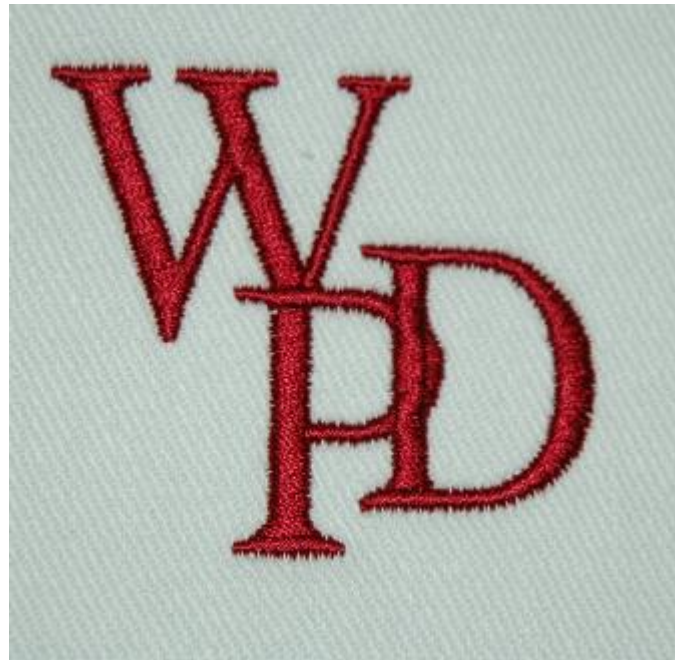
